Key Responsibilities:

Overseeing multiple projects at all times, you'll be accountable for successful delivery ensuring the team are led within budgets, time frames and to Health & Safety standards. Assist the Integrated projects Leader and liaise with the Technical Manager to establish the delivery strategy.

Ensure the relevant safety management system has been employed, that it is kept up to date and the team have been adequately trained.

Coordinate and manage the contract requirements relating to design solutions, construction and commissioning.

Ensure the CDMC is advised at the start of design and agree the CDM strategy for the review of PCI, DRA, construction drawings and any other relevant information for the project. Plan all aspects of the projects and agree every Plan for Stage with the Project Lead Work closely with the Technical Manager (TM) to agree the technical resource required – work closely with the design & construction managers forecast & manage resource costs throughout the project.

Agree clear standards & expectations

Ensure that sustainability principles in design and construction are fully applied in the projects; work collaboratively.

Find the best solutions to meet the Alliance targets - sustainability in design & construction, minimisation of the energy use, carbon emissions, waste materials reduction & the supply chain.

Keep track of all scope changes and ensure that the change control process and technical query process are adhered to on all projects.

Work with the Enabling team to ensure that all relevant enabling activities are undertaken in a timely and cost-effective manner.

Be responsible for ensuring the change control and early warning process is followed. Liaise with the customer and all other stakeholders to clarify requirements and agree project objectives and priorities.

Manage project risk and opportunities effectively - take responsibility for the identification, allocation and management of the project risk and opportunities, taking effective mitigation measures to reduce risk.

Ensure that design output is aligned with construction activity and delivered on time and vice versa.

Be accountable for the commercial objectives specific to the project - ensure necessary reporting & information is delivered on time, to the required standard.
