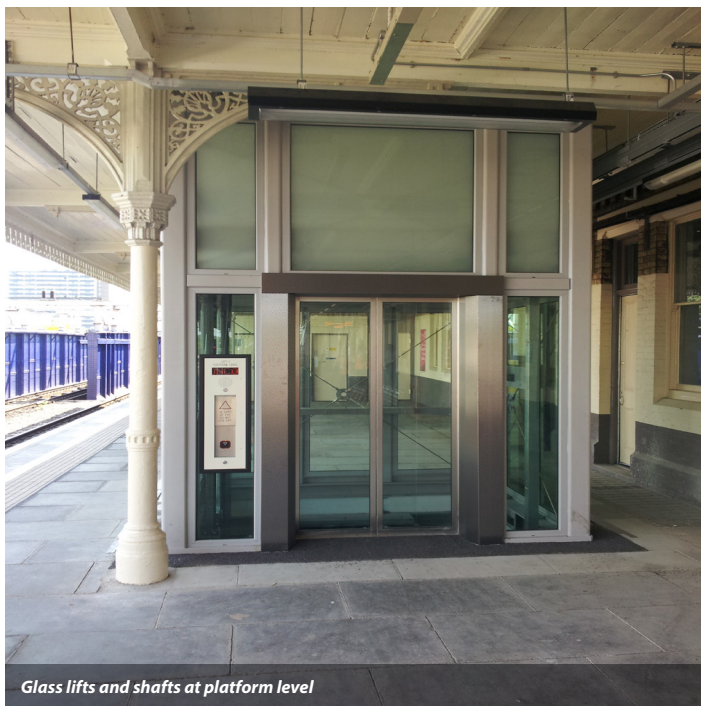


# Camden Road AFA

## In Brief...

Barhale were awarded the design and construct contract for the Access for All (AFA) station upgrade works to Camden Road Railway Station. AFA was a major development programme that aimed to improve accessibility to 160 train stations around the country.

The station is an 1870's grade II listed building sited on a series of brick arches, located in a London urban inner city location surrounded by a combination of commercial and residential buildings.

Two new lifts were provided from station concourse to platform level.

## Customer Benefits...

- Project was completed both on time and to budget, this was extremely important to the client as the station was an important transport link for London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games
- Worked efficiently despite the restrictions of the works being located within a Grade 2 listed building
- Works were carried out in a live station environment with key work areas hoarded off to minimise disruption to the general public
- The site set-up included viewing windows, incorporated in the hoarding which encouraged interaction with the station's passengers

## Technical Features...

As the station was a listed building glass material was used for the lifts and shafts at platform level. Works included:

- Installation of two new lifts / shaft within Spacia tenanted areas (breaking through arches)
- Installation of new power supply
- Installation of tactiles along platform length
- Installation / modification of lighting
- Installation of CCTV/telecoms
